SUMMER CONCERT - THE CHICHESTER MUSIC CENTRE July 6th - the three Chichester societies combined to fund the concert which involved 138 young musicians.

WEALDEN HEATHFIELD – has been supporting various projects including a one day workshop for GCSE and A level students at both Heathfield Community College and Uplands Community College.

CHICHESTER – continue to support the Technical Youth Programme at Chichester Festival Theatre.

CITY of CHICHESTER – has funded 1Term2Learn music projects at Parklands Community Primary School and Boxgrove C of E Primary School provided by West Sussex Music.

SOUTH DOWNS – funded the restoration and transformation of an unused room at Bury CE Primary School into an arts/craft studio. The finished studio was opened on June 21st. Sponsorship has also been given to a children's production of The Wind in The Willows at the Petworth Festival.
